

A quick guide to fees and funding

Little Oaks Nursery aims to provide flexible childcare to meet the needs of the families who use our services. We offer a range of sessions and this guide provides you with all the information you need to find out which session type would suit your family best.

What options are available?

Standard childcare sessions

Standard sessions are charged a full price and do not include any government funding. The session price includes all food, resources, toiletries and sun cream. We just ask parents to supply nursery with their chosen brand of nappies .

Sessions are provided on an all year round basis.

You can choose from full or a half day session and these can be booked as a regular weekly pattern.

You can choose a session pattern that meets your weekly childcare needs.

Funded childcare sessions

The government provides funding to cover either 15 or 30 hours childcare per week depending on your child's age and family circumstances. The table below provides more information.

How are government funded hours provided?

Funded hours can be taken on a term time only basis. You can choose from morning or afternoon sessions.

There are a limited number of funded places available for both 2,3 & 4 year olds.

What does the government funding cover?

Government funding is provided to cover your child's place at nursery and does not cover additional costs or extras. The extra essentials are the things that make our nursery special and enhance your child's development and learning opportunities. These include:

Play equipment and resources

including books, toys, outdoor play equipment, art supplies, all of which enhance your child's learning experience.

Toiletries

we ensure children are clean and comfortable whilst at nursery and provide all the products needed throughout the day.

Online information sharing apps

We know parents and carers like to keep track of their children's time at nursery. We use an online app to share these moments with you.

Staff training

Our staff team are dedicated to early years care and ongoing training is provided to ensure children receive the best support.

As a not for profit charity, we reinvest any profit we make back into the nursery. We ensure all children attending the nursery have access to all the little extras that make nursery special.

Additional extras

Meals

To ensure future sustainability of the nursery, we ask parents accessing funded hours to contribute to the cost of meals at a rate of £6.00 per full day session. Meals are itemised on your monthly invoice.

In order to keep the nursery allergy friendly, we do not allow packed lunches or food to be brought from home.

Non funded hours

In our experience, families often need more than the funded hours and so we have adapted our sessions to ensure parents have the most flexible options.

We do not provide childcare by the hour, which means funded hours will only cover a proportion of a full day session. Therefore non funded hours are used to cover the remaining hours of each session. These are charged at the standard rate and itemised on your invoice. See the next page for further information.

How the 30 Government funded hours are provided as stretched provision.

This will be made up of 22.4 Free Early Education hours per week and 9.1 additional hours. There will be an additional charge for lunches of £6.00 per day. The diagram below shows how a typical day is broken down into funded and non funded hours.



There are a limited number of term time only 30 hours places available. These are provided on a first come, first served basis. Please contact the office for more information.
